2. Explain how the witch-hunt years were a time of "general revenge."

3. What truths come out when the adults leave the girls alone?

7. What do Putnam and Proctor argue about? What does this reveal?

Putnam accuses Proctor of stealing/taking lumber from his part of the woods (32)

8. Though Tituba names her accomplices, who is the first person to actually mention names?

THOMAS PUTNAM! (46)

9. To what does Tituba confess? WHY? (Consider all factors)

Witchcraft, being an accomplice of the devil. She confesses, thinking it will avoid trouble. She's threatened with death if she doesn't confess "the truth."

10. Why isn't it difficult for Ann Putnam to believe that Goody Osburn is a witch?

Goody Osburn delivered three of Ann Putnam's babies. All three died, so Ann Putnam blames Goody Osburn for their deaths.

11. What do the girls do at the end of Act I? WHY do you think Abigail and Betty behave in this manner?

The girls start chanting names of people who they claim to be involved with the devil. The girls don't want to get in trouble and want to be seen as the innocent ones. They want ATTENTION!
