"Something Forbidding" (Maya and Aaron)

- 1. Who destroys the littluns' sandcastles?
 - Roger → "Roger led the way straight through the castles, kicking them over, burying the flowers, scattering the children's stones" (60)
 - IMMATURE, CHILDISH, MEAN
- 2. What does Roger do to cruelly bother Henry?
 - Roger throws rocks near Henry
 - "Roger gathered a handful of stones and began to throw them" (62).
 - He thinks it's a funny game
- 3. Why does Roger throw stones *near* Henry, instead of directly at him? Provide a quote to support your answer.
 - He feels that he would get into trouble throwing them directly at him, but he actually wouldn't because there's no strict civilization
 - "Round the squatting child was the protection of parents and school and policemen and the law. Roger's arm was conditioned by a civilization that knew nothing of him and was in ruins" (62).
 - Roger's personality is changing → "testing the waters" to see if he'd get into trouble

Painted Faces (Batel & Jason)

- 4. What colors does Jack use to paint his face?

 White eye socket, half face red, slashed black charcoal across face (63)
- 5. How does wearing this mask affect Jack's behavior and make him feel? Provide a quote to support your answer.
 - The mask made him feel wild; it enabled him to disguise himself so that he could behave viciously; motivates Jack to continue hunting and killing; he is no longer "Jack"
 - "The mask compelled them" (64).

"I've Been Thinking..." (Ray & Sharon)

- 6. Who is the only boy on the island whose hair never seems to grow?
 - Piggy → page 64
- 7. What does Piggy suggest that the boys create?
 - A sundial to tell time → will help maintain order, new rules
- 8. How do these two pieces of information relate to the motif of civilization?
 - Piggy has survival instincts because he has good ideas of how to help all the boys on the island.
 - Piggy = more civilized than the boys on the island
 - Longer hair = showing change into savagery, short hair shows how Piggy is not changing

Ships, Smoke, Smacks, & Symbolism (Kevin & Adiel)

- 9. What does Ralph spot on the horizon?
 - A ship!! → If it sees their smoke signal, it might come to help them!
 - "Smoke! Smoke!" (65)
- 10. Why is the signal fire out?
 - Jack and his hunters were in charge of fire signal → they went hunting for pigs instead!
 - Ralph: "You let the fire go out!" (69)
 - Jack gets a pig finally, but the ship passes and their chance of rescue is gone
 - Jack's priority: hunting; Ralph's priority: rescue
- 11. What violence does Jack commit toward Piggy? What object is broken as a result?
 - Jack punches Piggy in the stomach and hits him on the head → Piggy's glasses crack (only one lens)
 - "Piggy cried in terror. 'My specs!'" (71)
- 12. What do Piggy's glasses **symbolize**?
 - Glasses symbolize <u>intelligence</u> and <u>civilized society</u> (glasses make fire, which symbolizes rescue, help, warmth, safety)
 - One broken lens means intelligence and civilized society is decreasing

Blood & Rejoicing (Daniel & Raquel)

- 13. What do the hunters chant as they approach the group?
 - "Kill the pig! Cut her throat! Spill her blood!" (69).
- 14. Describe the killing of the pig on pages 74-75 and comment on the way the boys react to the killing. Provide a quote to support your answer.
 - Violent killing, throw spears, result = Jack slits the pig's throat
 - Boys are relieved and very excited → they celebrate the death, dancing → Kind of sick thing to celebrate; shows they are turning savage
 - "Kill the pig. Cut her throat. Bash her in." (75)
- 15. Who gives Piggy meat?
 - Simon $(74) \rightarrow$ generous
 - Jack wouldn't give Piggy meat
