Directions: Answer the following questions in full sentences. Provide page numbers indicating where you found the information, and, when possible, include a quote to support your response.

- 1. Identify a significant piece of information that is indirectly revealed in this quote: "His sandy hair, considerably longer than it had been when they dropped in, was lighter now; and his bare back was a mass of dark freckles and peeling sunburn" (48).
 - They've been on the island for a while now (long enough for their hair to grow long)
- 2. With what has Jack become obsessed? What is he searching for at the opening of the chapter?
 - Jack is obsessed with killing/hunting, but he hasn't been able to catch a pig yet
- 3. What is a compulsion?
 - An action/state when someone is obsessed with or forced to do something

Rephrase the following quote in your own words: "[Jack] tried to convey the compulsion to track down and kill that was swallowing him up" (51).

- -The need/desire to hunt is taking over him
- Jack has the urge to kill a pig
- Jack has extremely violent tendencies
- Can only think about hunting

He's turning more and more savage

- 4. Why are the littluns unable to sleep soundly at night?
 - They are scared of the beastie and are having terrible nightmares → littluns not supported/comforted by the older kids
- 5. What does Jack say he would like to do even more than he would like to be rescued? Provide a concrete detail.
 - Jack wants to catch a pig even more than he wants to be rescued → "Rescue? Yes, of course! All the same, I'd like to catch a pig first" (53).
 - Selfish, bad priorities, doesn't care about the wellbeing of others

- 6. What is the biggest problem Ralph is dealing with regarding the other boys? What does this reveal about his personality and priorities?
 - The other boys aren't really listening to him
 - Is he a weak leader, or are the boys just not good listeners?
 - Ralph has leadership skills (kind of smart, physically strong), but he needs help at times → no one but Piggy and Simon are helping him
 - Ralph's priority: SURVIVAL
 - Ralph and Jack have very different perspectives
- 7. Describe Simon. What does he look like? What is his personality like? Where does he go?
 - He faints
 - Skinny boy, black hair (55-56)
 - Jack and Ralph describe Simon as "queer" and "funny" (55) (queer = strange) → Simon is DIFFERENT somehow
 - Timid and shy
 - Helpful (helps Ralph with shelters, gets fruit for the littluns) (56)
 - He goes into the jungle to his "hideout"
 - Connection with nature
 - Isolates himself; likes to be alone \rightarrow Why? Maybe helps him think?

Annotations:

- Jack has become an animal, long hair, violent thoughts and behavior (50)
- Simon is mysterious to the other boys (55)
- Simon is kind and caring to the littluns (56-57)
- Jack is thirsty \rightarrow Ralph has set up organization to have water ready (50)
- Fear is starting to take over (52)
- Ralph is becoming more responsible and focused as a leader $(50) \rightarrow$ realizes the severity of the situation
- Jack: "If I could only get a pig, I'll come back and help with the shelter" (55) → ONLY hunting, not helping in other ways
- The boys are destructive
