Writing Assignment Self-edit Checklist

ROUGH DRAFT CHECKLIST

Format Check:

- Paragraph is indented
- Paragraph follows **chunk format**
- There are no floating quotes

Punctuation Check:

- Each sentence ends with a punctuation mark
- There are no run-on sentences (sentences that are too long and require punctuation)
- Transitions introduce each quote with either a colon (:) or a comma
(If the transition can stand on its own as a sentence, use a colon. If it cannot, use a comma.)
- Each quote is surrounded by quotation marks (ex. He said, “quote”)
- There are no contractions (ex. *can't* should be *cannot*, *it's* should be *it is*, etc.)

Capitalization Check:

- Every* sentence begins with a capital letter
- All proper nouns are capitalized
- No words or letters are capitalized that should *not* be capitalized

Spelling Check:

- Double-check your spelling – if you are unsure how to spell a word, look it up!
- All commonly confused words are used correctly (there/their/they're, than/then, etc.)

Substance Check:

- Topic sentence mentions the title of the text (books are italicized or underlined; short stories are quoted)
- Topic sentence mentions the author
- You do not use the word “I”.
- Concrete details relate to what you are trying to prove
